Call for Papers

The Austrian National Defense Academy invites you to the 12th International Civil-Military Relations Seminar. The

conference will take place in Vienna and will be hosted by the Institute for Human and Social Sciences (IHSS) of the National Defense Academy Vienna in cooperation with the Center for Civil-Military Relations (CCMR) of the Naval Postgraduate School (NPS)

This year's conference will be dedicated to the topic

"Democratic Control of Armed Forces in the European Security Context"

Since 11 September 2001, the topic of civil-military relations and especially democratic control of armed forces has become of current interest once again. Initially the requirement of policy and theory has been the integration of defense and military institutions in democratic statecraft in conjunction with the revolution in Europe. The revival of organized violence and the construction of Europe have raised new issues of policy and theory. Regarding the topic, the seminar 2008 analyzed especially the challenges of democratic and parliamentary accountability and control of security decision making processes of ESDP missions of the European Union. In 2009, the conference organizers wish to address the character of security, defense, and military institutions and the changing face of the soldier in the international system, the European Union, the nation state, and society.

The conference will be divided in four panels over three days. The first panel will address how democratic control of armed forces is currently implemented in member states of the European Union and who oversees and authorizes the decision making process for the deployment of armed forces in missions abroad. The second panel will discuss the different organizational approaches to democratic control of armed forces of European and transatlantic organizations concerned. The third panel speculates about country case studies focusing on the impact of contemporary security challenges and conflicts on all volunteer and conscript armed forces as well as their democratic civilian control. In

particular, what issues of policy have arisen in the last decade? Simply said, are all volunteer forces the ideal military institution for a 21st century democracy? The fourth panel focuses on privatization of security, defense, and military institutions and the implications for democratic civil-military relations. Does the rise of private military companies signify the subversion and pervasion of democratic control of armed forces? In addition, challenges of democratic control of armed forces regarding asymmetric warfare will also be discussed.

The organizing committee invites scholars, researchers, as well as civil and military defense experts to participate in the conference. We also invite the participants to contribute to the seminar by presenting a paper on a subject related to the second and third panel.

We are encouraging all interested colleagues to forward proposals for topics that should be covered at the conference, as well as to provide us with ideas for papers and presentations they would like to contribute to the conference proceedings.

Deadline for the submittal of proposals and papers:

October 10th, 2009

All papers and the proceedings of the seminar will be published in a Conference Compilation within the National Defense Academy Publication Series.

DEMOCRATIC CONTROL OF ARMED FORCES IN THE EUROPEAN SECURITY CONTEXT II

November 11th to 13th, 2009

This International Seminar will be offered by the Institute for Human and Social Sciences of the National Defense Academy, Vienna and conducted in cooperation with the Center for Civil-Military Relations,

Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey, California and the Austrian Institute for European and Security Policy, Maria Enzersdorf

Introduction and Background

After the end of the Cold War and since 11 September 2001, the topic of civil-military relations and especially democratic control of armed forces has become of current interest once again. After dealing with the problem of how to prevent a military intervention in transitional and newly developed democracies in Europe, parliamentary scrutiny and accountability of decisions for the deployment of military personnel abroad as become the main emphasis of reflection. Regarding this topic, the seminar will especially deal with the problem of democratic and parliamentary accountability of the decision-making process for (multinational) ESDP mission of the European Union as well as the challenges of democratic control because of the change from conscription to all volunteer forces in many European countries and the question of privatization of security and its impact on democratic control of armed forces.

Seminar Description and Objective

This seminar is the twelfth in a series undertaken by the Austrian National Defense Academy. As a followup seminar of the last year's symposium it will be divided in four panels over three days.

The first panel focuses on how democratic control of armed forces is currently implemented in member states of the European Union and who oversees and authorizes the decision making process for the deployment of armed forces in missions abroad. In addition, the panel will deal with the future development if the European Security and Defense Policy, especially the Battle Group Concept, the Permanent Structured Cooperation of the Lisbon Treaty and in some respect the development of a kind of "European Armed Forces".

The second panel will discuss the different organizational approaches to democratic control of armed forces of European and transatlantic organizations concerned, namely NATO, OSCE and the European Union.

The third panel will address the challenges of democratic control of armed forces because of the change from conscription to all volunteer forces in many European countries and focus on the question whether all volunteer forces are the ideal military institution for a 21st century democracy?

The fourth panel speculates on privatization of security and its impact on democratic control of armed forces.

Seminar Management
